## Directions to Camp Carpenter:

### **From Route 93 Traveling North:**

Take Exit 5 and turn right onto RT-28 / Rockingham Road. Take left after diner onto Auburn Road. At four-way stop, take a left onto Old Derry Road. Old Derry Road becomes Bodwell Road at the Manchester/Londonderry line. Turn right onto Blondin Road after passing the East Meadow condominium complex. Continue into camp.

### **From Route 93 Traveling South, Route 101, Route 293:**

Take Exit 1 off RT-293 onto RT-28 / South Willow Street. Go past two Mall of NH entrances and turn left at next intersection with traffic lights onto Huse Road. Go over highway and take next right onto Mooresville Road. Continue to the end of Mooresville Road and take a right onto South Mammoth Road. Go under highway and take next left onto Bodwell Road. Continue on Bodwell Road for 1.7 miles and take left onto Blondin Road. Continue into camp.
