General Information

Location	Raymond Sportsman Club 75 Branch rd Raymond,NH off rt 102
Check in	Friday night/Saturday morning check in for both camping and the Klondike will be at the designated area mark registration
Cost	\$12.00 per scout
Dates	February 7th to 9th
Medical Forms	Leaders for each UNIT need to have BOTH part A and part B of the BSA medical form for each scout and adult attending
Trash	Carry In/Carry Out.
Uniform	Class B's or Equivalent
Vehicles	ALL vehicles must be parked in the designated parking area.
Camp Site	We will all be camping in designated areas around the club
Camp Fires	ALL campfires MUST be in an above ground fire pit Campfire debris not in existing pits must be carried out. Fine white ash can be spread in the woods according to LNT
Unit Roster	Each unit must turn in a roster, including adults and scout that are just participating for the day.
Sleds Roster	Each sled can have between 4 and 8 scouts, no exceptions.
Dress	All Scouts at this event must be properly clothed for stormy (cold/wet) weather.
Sleds	Troops will supply their own, if needed we will have kits to sell and build prior to the derby
Equipment	All equipment needed for the competition must fit into the sled or be carried by the scouts
FIRST AID	<u>No</u> matter how minor, all injuries are to be reported to the first aid personnel at the First Aid Station, where they will be properly treated and logged in the District First Aid Book.
Scoring	Each Station varies and the ruling of the station staff is final.
Time allow at each station	Sleds will be allowed to stay at each station for a maximum of 20 minutes
Station cleanup	Scouts must clean up the station before leaving so the next group can have the same experience
First aid kit	Each sled must have a first aid kit or it will NOT be allowed to participate
Gloves	Sled must have protective/work gloves for each scout
Lunch	Lunch must be taken at 12:00, we will sound the horn
Travel during event	All sleds must travel in a counter clockwise direction from there starting station
Wampum	Sleds can earn wampum beads for "Scout Spirit" during the event, both at the station and on the trail. Up to 5 beads can be awarded by the station staff
Dinner	Back at camp or optional spaghetti dinner for troops spending the night. Will be served in the club house.

Exeter

The Challenge:

Your troop has come into a white out along the trail. A scout has fallen and hurt his ankle. You must carry him the rest of the way through the trail with guidance from the other scouts leading the way. Good Luck!!

Raymond

The Challenge:

Along the trail your horse suffers a massive injury and cannot go on. You must move it off the trail so the rest of the scouts can move through.

Stratham

The Challenge:

Your Patrol has snuck into the enemies back door and now must figure a way to climb to the top of the cliff and retrieve their flag

Portsmouth

The Challenge:

Night fall will be coming soon, it's time to look for a place to set up camp, get a **Fire** going to warm up and cook some food for the patrol

Hampton

The Challenge:

After crossing the river on your journey, you are soaked and must dry your clothes. You must build a **wooden structure** that you can hang your clothes and boots on and keep them off the ground near the fire to dry

Deerfield

The Challenge:

The weather has turned drastically. The patrol must stop and set up to get out of the weather, and it needs to be quick.

Candia

The Challenge:

You have come to a deep and wide **Gully** along the trail. The patrol must put their heads together and figure out how they are going to get across. It's going to take too long to go around and the enemy is not too far behind.

Kingston

The Challenge:

The Patrol has just crossed a frozen lake but as everyone was getting off one of the scouts slipped and has fallen through the ice, what are you going to do?

Sled Equipment List:

- **Patrol sized first aid kit (you will NOT be allowed to compete without this!)**
- **50' to 100' of Appropriate Strength Rope**
- **Scoutbook**
- **4 Scout Staves**
- All scouts dressed properly for the weather
- Any equipment you feel you need for the above events.
- Food for lunch
- Water
- Equipment for cooking lunch
- Adequate cleanup materials and trash bags for all wood, paper, garbage, etc.
- **Whatever else you think will help you along the trail**
