PEER-TO-PEER INSTRUCTIONS

Plan or Identify a High-Impact Scouting Experience

Choose a meeting or event that guest youth will:

- Find interesting, exciting and memorable
- Participate in a hands-on activity
- Get to know a few of the Scouts better and learn about how awesome your troop is



3 Weeks Prior

(and right after something your troop particularly enjoyed)

- Give the troop 20 minutes to talk about the things they like most about Scouting and their troop
- Ask existing troop members to make a list of everyone they know who could be in their troop
- Challenge them
 - 1. To include youth who may not be in their immediate circle of friends
 - 2. To not decide for anyone else that they "cant" or "wouldn't" join
 - 3. To create a list with three or more times as many names as are already registered in the troop

2 Weeks Prior

- Add names remembered since the list was made and clean up duplicates
- Assign every name on the list to 3 current scouts who know them
- · Scouts each fill out a Buddy Card (legibly) for each guest they will invite
- During the following week, every prospective scout on the list is enthusiastically invited to the upcoming event or activity, and given a buddy card with time, date and location on it
 - 1. Every prospective scout gets a personal invite from three friends
 - 2. Make person-to-person invitations! Social media can be used as a reminder, but not as the only invite.

1 Week Prior

Scouts personally remind those who have been invited. Call and offer rides.

Day of the Meeting

· Don't forget reminders!

At the Meeting

- Make prospective youth feel totally at home right away
- Get guests directly involved in activities right away
- Have an adult volunteer present to meet with the parents
 - 1. Explain Scouting and answer their questions while youth are participating
 - 2. Give them youth applications (and adult applications if interested)
 - 3. Share promotional brochures
- Be sure to announce the upcoming cool activities and outings they can go on if the join
- Specifically and personally invite them all back to a specific meeting/event
- Collect registrations that night

Follow Up

- · During the next two weeks, Scouts should:
 - 1. Personally thank their friends for coming
 - 2. Ask guests how they liked the event
 - 3. Share what they like most about Scouting
 - 4. Invite them back
- Leaders respond to all questions / requests for information that parents expressed at the meeting. Encourage parents to encourage Scouting.





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
