## **Hon. Gerard J. Boyle**

Silver Buffalo Recipient



For decades, Judge Boyle has led with distinction across Scouting, the military, the judiciary, and civic organizations. As Council President and long-serving Executive Board of the Council, he has guided strategic growth and strengthened Scouting throughout New Hampshire. His national and international Scouting service includes roles as Base Camp Chief at the National Jamboree, NYLT Course Director, Philmont staff, and key leadership at the Normandy Camporee in France. A retired Colonel in the U.S. Marine Corps, he served as a Judge Advocate and oversaw large-scale joint-service training exercises involving thousands of personnel.

In his civilian career, Judge Boyle served for 20 years as a New Hampshire Circuit Court Judge, where he founded the state's Teen Court and Mental Health Courts—pioneering programs that continue to serve vulnerable youth. He is a tireless advocate for education and prevention, speaking annually to thousands of students on issues such as substance abuse, bullying, and child safety. Most recently, he launched New Hampshire's Safeguarding Youth Symposium, bringing together organizations from across the state to strengthen youth protection efforts.

A Vigil Honor member of the Order of the Arrow, and recipient of both the Silver Beaver and Silver Antelope Awards, Judge Boyle lives the values of Scouting through every facet of his life. His service is matched by his humility, passion, and deep commitment to making a lasting difference.

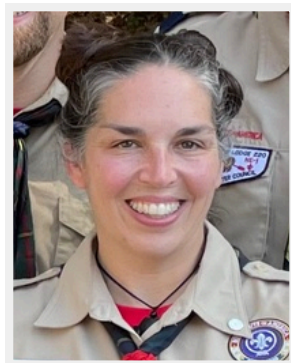

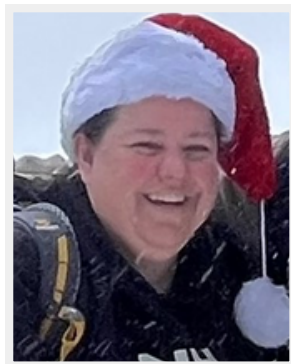

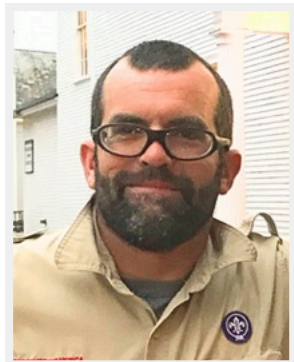
Professionally, Barry retired from Raytheon where he worked in engineering management.

He donated time, materials, and labor—valued at over \$50,000—to construct standing seam metal pavilion roofs at both Hoge Base and Hidden Valley. He is currently leading a renovation of the Hoge Base cabin to meet safety and accessibility standards—all free of charge and on his own time.

Outside of Scouting, Lloyd supports his local community through volunteer construction projects, including work for the Tunbridge Grange. He is described by fellow Scouters as one of the most effective leaders seen in over 40 years of local Scouting. Professionally, Lloyd owns and operates Defying Gravity Construction and brings the same commitment to excellence in his trade to his volunteer work. Whether he's building roofs or building character, Lloyd's heart for service, hands-on leadership, and deep commitment to youth make him truly deserving to be recognized.

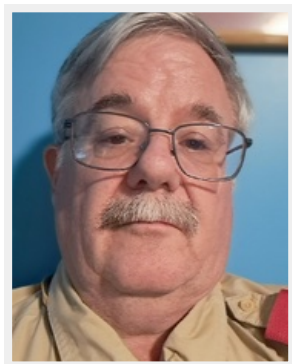
