Distinguished Eagle Scout Award (DESA)

The Distinguished Eagle Scout Award (DESA) was established in 1969 by the National Eagle Scout Association to recognize Eagle Scouts who achieve extraordinary national-level recognition, fame, or eminence within their profession and/or service to the nation and have a strong record of voluntary service to their community.

The DESA is thus NESA's highest honor for Eagle Scouts.

Stringent criteria begin with a minimum of 25 years "Time in Service" from the official record date, and an Eagle rank was earned. That requirement was determined by the average time most nominees need to establish a career, gain peer recognition, awards, fame/eminence, and other factors considered for DESA selection.

A committee comprised of Distinguished Eagle Scouts carefully reviews all nominations and determines selections.

DOUGLAS S. ACKROYD

NOESA Honoree

After a long and distinguished career, Lt. Colonel Douglas Aykroyd retired from the United States Army. A 1969 United States Military Academy graduate at West Point, he was commissioned as an Armor Officer and served in West Germany and Belgium. In 1972, he transitioned from Armor to Aviation, attending flight school and piloting helicopters during the Vietnam War.

During his military service, Lt. Colonel Aykroyd was awarded numerous honors, including the Bronze Star Medal, the Air Medal, three Meritorious Service Medals, and the Legion of Merit.

An active leader in Scouting throughout his military assignments, he often served as Scoutmaster and contributed significantly to youth development. Locally, he has been a dedicated Scouting America New Hampshire member, supporting the Scouting Museum and serving for many years as Scoutmaster—and now Assistant Scoutmaster—of Troop 277 in Hampton, New Hampshire.

He has also served as Adviser for the Order of the Arrow newsletter and volunteered at numerous Council events, including the Klondike Derby. He served as a Scoutmaster at a National Jamboree, further exemplifying his commitment to the Scouting program.

Beyond Scouting, Lt. Colonel Aykroyd actively contributes to his community. He volunteers during elections for the Town of Hampton, NH, and serves at the Portsmouth Athenaeum, reflecting his passion for history. A collector and researcher of West Point cadet pins, he combines his historical interests with a deep connection to his alma mater.

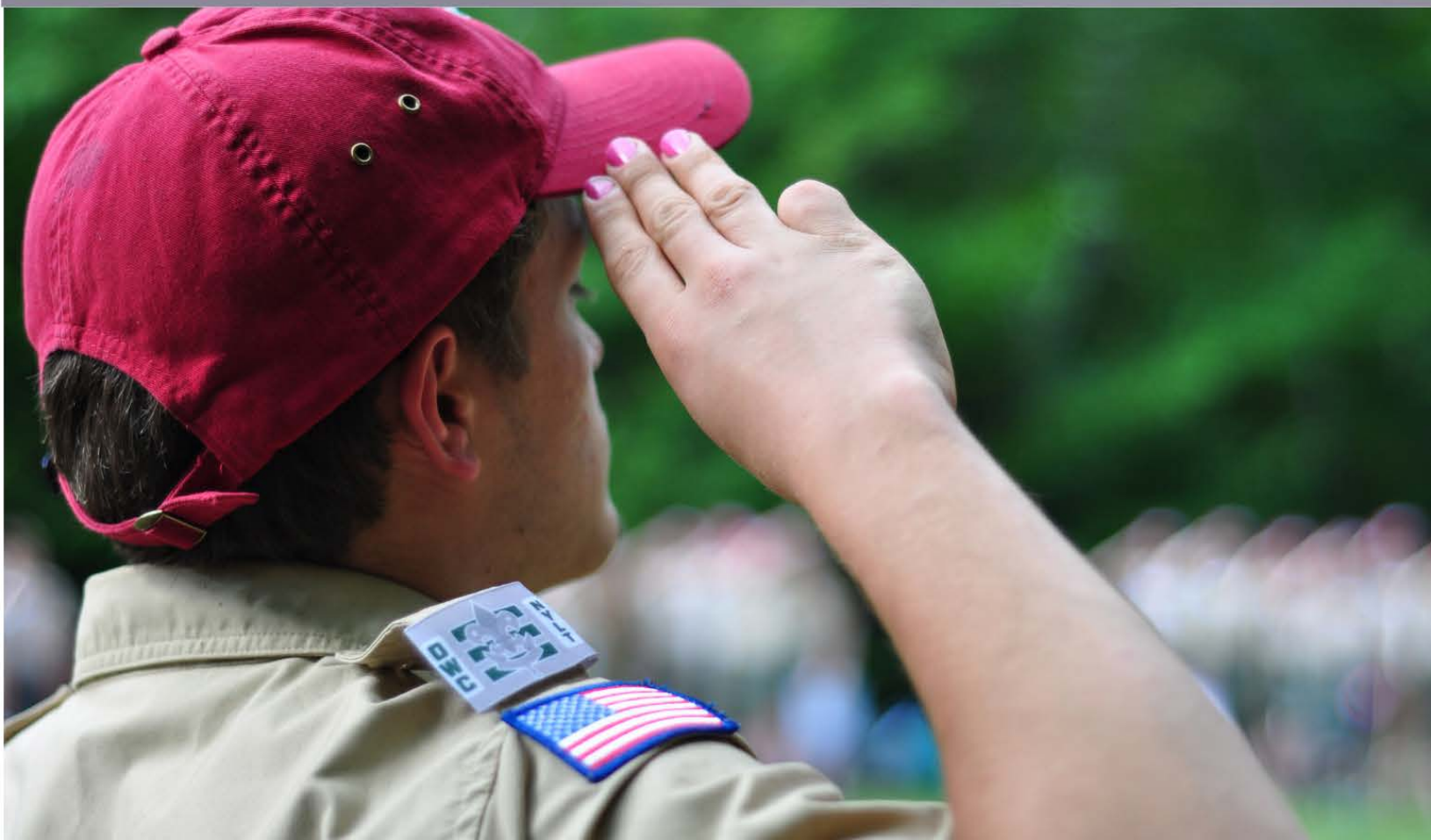

NOESA Honoree

Rob Therrien is President of The Melanson Company, a family-owned roofing and construction business with five offices across New Hampshire and Vermont. Rob grew up in Swanzey, NH, graduating from Monadnock Regional High School as a three-sport athlete and later earning his Professional Bachelor of Architecture degree cum laude from the University of Detroit Mercy.

Rob began working at Melanson as a child alongside his father, learning the business from the ground up—from sweeping floors and sorting hardware to managing complex roofing projects. He eventually led the company as President in 2002 and assumed full operational control in 2005.

Rob earned his Eagle Scout Award in 1976, just after turning 13, with a project coordinating Swanzey's July 4th Bicentennial Celebration. A lifelong supporter of Scouting, he is a Good Scout Award recipient and alumnus of Camp Carpenter, Hidden Valley, and Mead Wilderness Base. He has remained committed to the values of Scouting throughout his career and personal life.

Rob and his wife, Lianne—his high school sweetheart—have built a large and close-knit family with five children, their spouses, and 17 grandchildren. Four generations of Therriens have worked in the Melanson business, and their oldest company is celebrating its 150th anniversary this year.

In addition to his professional success, Rob is a devoted community leader. He has coached youth baseball and soccer, led facility improvements on local fields, and participated in more than a dozen humanitarian trips to El Salvador with Rotary to build homes. He's held key leadership roles with local organizations including the Keene Rotary Club, Cheshire Health Foundation, Takodah YMCA, Monadnock United Way, and the Historical Society of Cheshire County. When not working, which is time with family and friends, naturally, that typically involves time at home in Swanzey or up in Oquossoc, ME. Golf, hunting, fishing, snowmobiling, side by side riding, cocktails and travel are all part of the mix.

Ryan's Scouting journey began in 1993 as a Tiger Cub with Pack 21 in Hudson, New Hampshire. His father introduced him to the program. Ryan experienced a profound loss shortly after joining when his father passed away. In an inspiring act of resilience, his mother stepped in as a Den Leader, ensuring his continued participation and growth in Scouting.

From those early days, the values and mission of Scouting became a guiding force in Ryan's life.

After earning the Arrow of Light, Ryan bridged into Troop 21, where Scouting provided structure, purpose, and a vital support system. He held nearly every youth leadership position, including Den Chief, Patrol Leader, Quartermaster, and Senior Patrol Leader. He particularly enjoyed summer camps at Griswold Scout Reservation and was among the first Scouts to camp at Camp Bell in 2002, during its inaugural season of patrol-style programming.

Ryan earned the rank of Eagle Scout in 2004. In response to 9/11, he organized a blood drive with the American Red Cross for his Eagle project, surpassing his donation goals. He went on to earn his Bronze Eagle Palm before aging out of the program. Ryan has reconnected with Scouting as an adult through Scouting America New Hampshire, serving on the Executive Board since 2013 and currently as Treasurer. In 2019, he was awarded the Silver Beaver for his exceptional volunteer service.

Professionally, Ryan is an assurance partner at BerryDunn, a nationally recognized public accounting firm. He serves clients in various industries, including manufacturing, technology, wholesale distribution, professional services, and natural resources.

2024 Eagle Project of the Year

Assisted Migration at Grey Rocks

Mika partnered with the Newfound Lakes Region Association (NLRA) for her Eagle Scout Service Project to design, build, and install educational signs at the Grey Rocks Conservation Area.

The project aimed to raise awareness about climate change, invasive species, and the concept of assisted migration as an ecological response.

Originally, Mika planned to plant sycamore trees, but she split the project into two phases due to age restrictions for planting on public land. Phase one, her Eagle Project, focused on signage. Phase two, completed as her high school senior project, involved planting the trees.

Mika created five 12x18" plastic signs mounted on angled plywood platforms. The signs covered climate change, invasive species, assisted migration, personal action steps, and the importance of sycamore trees in climate resilience. One focus was the bittersweet vine, an invasive species threatening native vegetation. The signs helped visitors learn how to identify and manage this local threat.

As part of her outreach, Mika presented the project to the 8th-grade class at her local middle school, encouraging environmental awareness among younger students. The project also served as a leadership development experience. Mika learned to delegate tasks and manage a team effectively—key skills in completing a complex community effort.

By combining education with local action, Mika's project supports the NLRA's mission and leaves a lasting impact on Grey Rocks and its visitors.

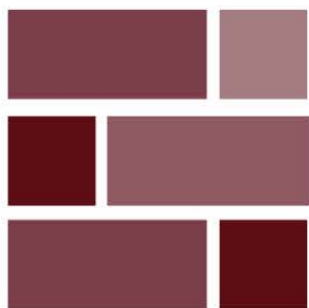
